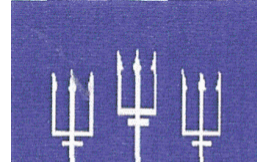

## **Objectives Of The United States Power Squadrons**

**The Objectives of the United States Power Squadrons shall be:**

- a) To associate congenial persons of good character having a common love and appreciation of yachting as a nation-wide fraternity of boaters.
- b) To encourage and promote yachting, power and sail, and to provide through local squadrons and otherwise a practical means to foster fraternal and social relationships among persons interested in yachting.
- c) To encourage and promote a high amateur standard of skill in the handling and navigation of yachts, power and sail; to encourage and promote the study of the science and art of navigation, seamanship, and small boat handling; to develop and promote instructional programs for the benefit of members; and to stimulate members to increase their knowledge of and skill in yachting, through instruction, self-education, and participation in marine sports activities and competition.
- d) To encourage its members to abide by recognized yachting traditions, customs, and etiquette.
- e) To render and encourage its members to render such altruistic, patriotic, or other civil service as it may from time to time to determine or elect.



The St. Louis Power Squadron Burgee was designed in 1955 by Richard L. Lodge, a member of the squadron. The burgee logo on a field of white with a red background together with three USPS white and blue chevrons represents King Louis IX, Crusader King of France, 1214-1270, later canonized after death as Saint Louis; Patron Saint to King Louis XV of France. In 1764 a group of French settlers along the Mississippi River named their settlement after the Patron Saint Louis of France; City of St. Louis.

### **Historical Background of the St. Louis Sail & Power Squadron**

**THE ST. LOUIS POWER SQUADRON** was chartered on 22 May 1955  
mainly by three St. Louisans. P/C Wilson Dalzell, JN, President of Premier Studios; P/

C Otto McDaniel, AP, an executive with Southwestern Bell Telephone Company; and P/C Fridtjof S. Egilsrud, AP, former Professor of Engineering at the Pratt Institute in Brooklyn, New York; and later associated with his brother-in-law General Lief Sverdrup of the Sverdrup and Parcel Engineering firm in St. Louis.

Past Commander Egilsrud was a member of a power squadron unit on Long Island Sound in New York and for many years was an avid yachtsman on the Eastern seaboard. Together these three men felt that the St. Louis recreational boating community had a great deal to gain by the formation of a squadron to promote education in respect to safe boating not only of the members but the St. Louis community of boaters in general. A short time later these men were joined by a former officer of the British Navy, P/R/C Nigel White, N.

For approximately eleven years, meetings and classes were held at Premier Studios, 3033 Locust Street, St. Louis, MO. Members taking advanced courses experienced many fascinating moments in the evening sitting amongst the props and settings of the day's filming of a wildlife show of the St. Louis Zoo; of which Mr. Moke, the famous 'talking chimp,' was the star attraction. Amid these settings, the students were taught the basics of seamanship by dedicated instructors

In the early years the St. Louis Power Squadron was attached to District 50, which extended to Hawaii and beyond. Later St. Louis was assigned to D/20, headquartered in Chicago, IL.

Due to the diligent efforts of two St. Louis Past Commanders, together with others, P/V/ C Edward Sanders, JN, and P/R/C White, District 30 was founded in St. Louis in the spring of 1975. In addition to St. Louis, District 30 consists of eight squadrons extending from northern Iowa to eastern Kansas. St. Louis was the sponsor of a division that later became the Kansas City Power Squadron and, still later, an outgrowth from Kansas City became the Jayhawk Squadron in Topeka, KS, which is no longer in existence.

The St. Louis squadron has always been proud of its contributions to the United States Power Squadrons. The following St. Louis Commanders went on to become District Commanders: Edward F. Sanders, Nigel N. White, Frank A. Winkler, David A. Smith, Emil E. Fleck, Jr., Robert J. McManimie, Richard B. Zeiss, Edward P. Bialecke, Dennis Teeling, Gregory Dostal, Rosemary Bialecke and Gus Elia. Of these district commanders, P/V/C Edward F. Sanders became the National Treasurer of USPS and P/R/C Nigel N. White became a staff officer in the National Education Department.

**St. Louis Sail and Power Squadron (SLSPS) recognizes the busy schedules of today’s recreational boaters. Our activities are performed by volunteers and are designed to fit into their available time. Furthering your boating education with USPS courses, participating in civic activities, and then joining the “fun” social activities can contribute to safe boating and a very satisfying and rewarding experience with St. Louis Sail and Power Squadron.**

#### **United States Power Squadrons Organization**

**National** – USPS headquarters is in Raleigh, NC. As Squadrons members grow and assume additional responsibilities many volunteer to work on National Committees.

Key activities include working with outside agencies to coordinate our educational and other efforts, developing educational programs, maintaining a web site that communicates USPS activities to the Districts and Squadrons, producing and printing *The ENSIGN*, coordinating membership programs and many other activities.

**District** – There are 33 Districts with responsibilities similar to National but narrowed to implementation at the District level. Again, District personnel are volunteers that usually come from the Squadrons within the District. SLSPS is part of District 30 .

**Squadron** – Each Squadron is managed by a Bridge and Executive Committee. The Bridge consists of officers elected by the membership:

- Commander** – Presides over squadron meetings and performs other volunteer boating organization management tasks.
- Executive Officer** – Second in command, heads up key Squadron initiatives and prepares to be the next Commander.
- Education Officer** – Responsible for the Squadron educational program including public courses, as well as courses for members.
- Administrative Officer** – Responsible for all internal functions of the Squadron plus the Squadron website, and recruiting new members.
- Secretary** – Prepares minutes of meetings, maintains the Squadron data base and oversees publishing of the Squadron newsletter and roster.
- Treasurer** – Prepares budgets, collects dues, maintains membership records, collects and disburses funds<sup>9</sup>as appropriate.

**Squadron Committees:**

Some examples are Membership, Cooperative Charting, Boat Shows, Vessel Safety Inspection, Public and Advanced Grade courses, and Public Relations. **New members are encouraged to get involved by joining a committee that can benefit from their skills and interests.**

**Grades and Merit Marks:**

**Grade** – Indicates a members educational accomplishments:

- S – has completed Seamanship
- P – has completed S and Piloting
- AP – has completed S, P and Advanced Piloting
- JN – has completed S, P, AP and Junior Navigation
- N – has completed the above plus Navigation
- SN – Senior Navigator, members who have passed all advanced grade and elective courses.

**Merit Marks** – Each member may earn one Merit Mark each year. The Commander issues Merit Marks to those who have performed volunteer service by serving on Squadron committees and other activities. Examples are: helping with the Public Boating Course, performing Vessel Safety Checks, teaching or assisting with a class, or any other activity that benefits the Squadron.

**United States Power Squadrons  
Educational Courses**

**THE LIGHT THAT NEVER FAILS** in fair weather or in foul is the knowledge of the boatman who knows instantly what should be done to safeguard his boat and passengers in time of emergency. Such knowledge is readily available in United States Power Squadron courses covering all phases of safe boat handling and navigation.

If your boating knowledge is incomplete, why not enroll in the course or courses that will help you become a well-informed, dependable skipper?

**BOATING** The basic free course in boating for non-members. This course includes the topics of safety afloat, seamanship, aids to navigation, charts and plotting courses, use of the mariner's compass, government regulations, rules of the road, and small boat handling. This course is designed to educate the average boater in the rudiments of boating and provide him/her with the knowledge essential for safe and competent operation of his boat.

## ADVANCED GRADES

**The SEAMANSHIP ("S")** course builds on the basics of recreational boating presented in the public boating course. It facilitates the development of safe operating procedures for recreational boats and provides a basis for completion of USCG licensing examination. Emphasis is placed on higher level boating skills, rules of the road, and marlinspike. The course includes a copy of *"The One-Minute Guide to the Nautical Rules of the Road"* which satisfies Coast Guard requirements for carrying the rules on board.

**The PILOTING ("P")** Course covers the basics of coastal and inland navigation. The course embraces GPS as a primary navigation tool while covering enough of the traditional techniques so that the student will be able to find his/her way even if their GPS fails. Topics covered include: Use of GPS, Pre-planning safe courses, Monitoring progress, and The "Seaman's Eye".

**The ADVANCED PILOTING ("AP")** course continues to build coastal and inland navigation skill, allowing the student to take on more challenging conditions – unfamiliar waters, limited visibility, and extended cruises. GPS is embraced as a primary navigation tool while adding radar, chartplotters, and other electronic navigation tools. Topics covered include: Advancing a line of position, Hazard avoidance techniques, Collision avoidance using radar and GPS, Working with tides: clearances, depth, effects of current. The "Educational Proficiency Award" is given for completion of AP and any three elective courses.

**The JUNIOR NAVIGATION ("JN")** course is the first in a two-part

program of study in offshore navigation. It is designed as a practical "how to" course. Subject matter includes: Precise time determination, Use of the Nautical Almanac, Taking sextant sights of the sun, Reducing sights to establish lines of position, Special charts and plotting sheets for offshore navigation, Offshore navigational routines for recreational craft.

**NAVIGATION ("N")** course is the second part of the study of offshore navigation, further developing the student's understanding of celestial navigation theory. The *Navigation 2009* course deals with learning celestial positioning using other bodies, in addition to positioning using the sun. This course also deals with electronic software tools that can be used to plan and execute an offshore voyage. You will first learn to reduce these sights by the *Law of Cosines* method. Later in the course, you will learn an additional method of sight reduction, the *Nautical Almanac Sight Reduction (NASR)* method. You will also learn about sight planning techniques. With that knowledge, you will have the tools to take sights and complete your Navigation Sight Folder. The course includes a chapter on using a software-based voyage planning tool and a navigation program. The final chapter of the course contains a Practice Cruise that ties the separate elements of the course together.

## **.ELECTIVE COURSES**

**The CRUISE PLANNING ("CP")** course is designed for members who plan to cruise for just a day or for a year--in either a sail or powerboat--this course covers the following topics: Cruise preparation and planning, Boat and Equipment, Anchors and Anchoring, Security, Chartering, Cruising Outside the United States, Crew and Provisioning, Voyage Management, Communications, Navigation, Weather, and Emergencies.

**The ENGINE MAINTENANCE ("EM")** course stresses the diagnosis of modern systems, while also teaching the basics of engine layout and operation. Gasoline inboards, outboards, and diesel engines are taught in a way that reinforces the common aspects of how engines work.

Modern engines offer high reliability and good performance through the use of computerized systems for fuel delivery and engine timing. Most of these systems are "black boxes" that can no longer be serviced by weekend mechanics with ordinary tools. The EM course covers those repairs that do-it-yourselfers can still perform, teaches how to diagnose problems that might be beyond your ability to fix, and how to share information with your mechanic so the right repairs get performed.

**MARINE ELECTRONICS (“ME”)** The Marine Electronics course consists of three modules. There are no prerequisites for any of these modules; however, it is suggested that a member take ME 101 before taking ME 102. All three modules must be successfully completed to receive credit for Marine Electronics.

ME 101, Boat Electrical Systems, provides information about properties of electricity, electrical power requirements and wiring practices, DC power, AC power, galvanic and stray-current corrosion, lightning protection, and electrical interference.

ME 102, Marine Radio Communications, delves into radio waves and transmitters, receivers, antennas and transmission lines, FCC Rules and Regulations, FCC Frequency Plan, marine radiotelephone operating procedures, and other communication services (Emergency Position Indicating Radio Beacon (EPIRB), Digital Selective Calling (DSC), Global Maritime Distress and Safety System (GMDSS), satellite communications, amateur radio, and more).

ME 103, Marine Electronics for Navigation, presents information on depth sounders, RADAR, LORAN-C, GPS Navigation, and two new chapters: Electronic Charting, and Computer-Assisted Navigation (CAN). Members may take this module independent of any other ME module.

**The WEATHER (“W”)** course is concerned with what the weather is all about and how its many variations can be predicted. Throughout the course, the student is encouraged to make observations and predictions on his or her own, so that principles learned in class may be applied to activities on the water.

**The SAIL (“SA”)** course is proof that the USPS is not just for the motorboat skipper! It covers sail terminology, types of rigs and hulls, the theory of sailing with emphasis on the balance of hull and sails, stability, and other related topics.

**INSTRUCTOR QUALIFICATION COURSE** This course can be of great value to members who would like to teach, yet hesitate due to lack of experience; as well as for those who already teach and would like to increase their classroom effectiveness. It is also of value to persons other than instructors, providing guidance in preparing and conducting meetings; as well as in the making of all types of presentations. Also covered is the use of many types of visual aids.

#### **SUPPLEMENTARY COURSES**

Supplementary courses have no examinations and are not for credit, though Certificates of Completion are offered.

**OCEANOGRAPHY** A fascinating study of the waters on which we float, what is in and under them; and the forces, which work upon them.

**BOAT INSURANCE** A thorough description of various types of insurance for boaters and their widely varied vessels, with definitions and advice on what to expect in policies.

**PRINCIPLES of WATER-SKIING SAFETY** This course does not teach one to water ski, but it does provide essential background knowledge as to skills required, equipment, boats and boat drivers, signals, and, safety.

**SCUBA PRINCIPLES** Information necessary for SCUBA (Self-Contained Underwater Breathing Apparatus) training, touching on physical requirements and limitations, preparation, safety equipment and procedures, buoyancy laws, general rules, and the types of courses available for SCUBA diving. It is not a substitute for in-water training.

**ELEMENTS of BOAT DESIGN and CONSTRUCTION** An extension of the Seamanship course, and desirable for S Instructors, this program goes more deeply into the technical aspects of design, stability, and handling characteristics of boats, as well as their construction and materials.

**PREDICTED LOG CONTESTS** A “how-to-do-it” course on the time, speed, and distance problems involved in one of the favorite USPS competitive activities predicted log contests.

**NAVIGATOR UPDATE PROGRAM** As its name implies, this course is intended to help those who have passed the Navigator course to learn modern methods adopted by the academies and service schools, including use of H.O. 229 in sight reductions. Sight taking is not required.

**HAND TOOLS** A broad overview to acquaint the student with the availability, function, and proper use of hand tools. The program sections are organized as to tool function: i.e.; hitting and splitting, tuning, cutting, gripping, fastening, etc.

**PREPARATION for COAST GUARD LICENSE** This course uses USCG publications as primary texts, and provides the necessary information to allow the student to take the USCG exam for the “Operator” ticket (license for Motorboat Operator of vessels of less than 100 gross tons, carrying six or more passengers for hire).

**INTRODUCTION TO ASTRONOMY** A non-technical introduction to the identification and location of prominent celestial objects, particularly those of importance to navigators. The student is taken through the process in easy steps with notes on observational techniques, historical references, multiple stars, and the magnitude scale.

**COMPASS ADJUSTING** the cause of compass errors and deviation, as well as the techniques of proper compass installation, adjustment, and calibration are discussed. Various methods of obtaining magnetic headings (sun bearings, ranges, reciprocal bearings, sun compass, etc.) are covered.

**CALCULATORS for NAVIGATION** This is a broad coverage of the use of hand held calculators for the solution of navigational and piloting problems. Detailed descriptions of the use of virtually all types of instruments are included, (Reverse Polish and Algebraic Notation / simple 4-function, and fully programmable models).

## Ship Radio Telephone Rule Reminders

1. Whenever the radio is turned on, monitor Channel 16.
2. Use VHF Channel 16 (156.8 MHz) and SSB Channel 51 (2182 kHz) for calling, distress, urgency or safety only.
3. Listen before transmitting. Avoid interference with distress or other communications in progress.
4. When you hear MAYDAY - Listen! Don't talk unless you can help.
5. No "rag chewing" - idle chatter ties up limited channel space.
6. Talk 3 . . . Wait 10.
7. Give your call sign.
8. Keep a log.
9. Answer violation notices.
10. Use of indecent language or profanity on the air is a criminal offense.
11. **FALSE OR FRAUDULENT DISTRESS SIGNALS ARE PROHIBITED.**
12. Note that VHF Channel 09 has been designated as an alternative hailing frequency, although this is a fairly new development and not many boaters in this area seem to be aware of it as of yet.
13. VHF Channel 70 is now reserved for digital communication ONLY. Do not use this frequency as a working channel.

### ***IF YOU ARE IN DISTRESS . . .***

1. **SEND** radiotelephone alarm signal, if possible, to attract attention of other ships.
2. **SAY** slowly and distinctly on the distress frequency, **VHF Channel 16** (156.8 MHz) **or SSB Channel 51** (2182 kHz):
  - (a) **MAYDAY, MAYDAY, MAYDAY, THIS IS** \_\_\_\_\_  
(Call sign repeated three times).
  - (b) **GIVE** the name of your ship.
  - (c) **GIVE** your geographical position.
  - (d) **TELL** the nature of the distress.
  - (e) **EXPLAIN** what kind of assistance you need.
    - (f) **GIVE** any information that will help you to be rescued. (Ship type, hull color, number of masts, length of ship, etc.)
3. **REPEAT** distress calls and distress message at intervals until you get an answer.
4. Try any other available frequency to get help if you get no answer to your distress call.
5. **GIVE** priority to **DISTRESS, URGENCY, and SAFETY** messages in that order: **MAYDAY, PAN-PAN, & SECURITE.**

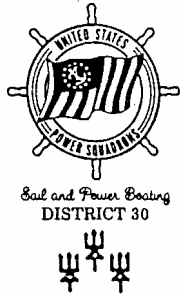
